Position Summary:

The mission of United Way Monterey County (UWMC) is to engage the community and focus resources to improve lives in Monterey County. The AmeriCorps VIP will provide day-to-day facilitation and support to assigned community engagement initiatives, including signature volunteer events, corporate partner engagement and volunteer stewardship.

VIP Fellows work as a part of a team to coordinate volunteer programs and to coach and support a cadre of high-value volunteers. The VIP Fellows' primary role is developing the United Way's capacity to recruit and manage volunteers. VIP Fellows spend time in the community, building partnerships, and forging lasting relationships.

Responsibilities and Duties:

Volunteer Management

- Develop partnerships with agencies to engage corporate volunteers in activities aligned with the UWMC impact priorities.
- Assist in the cultivation and tracking of relationships with volunteer programs that align with UWMC impact priority areas
- Implementation and improvement of corporate volunteer group engagement processes and projects.
- Develop and manage an online portal to connect volunteers to targeted UWMC impact priority areas.
- Assist in creation of marketing materials related to community engagement activities.
- Assist in the development and cultivation of UWMC auxillary groups including Emerging Leaders Society.

Signature Volunteer Events

- Provide consistent and quality communication of volunteer engagement opportunities that support the UWMC impact agenda.
- Assist with annual signature volunteer events, including but not limited to Community Service Awards, Stuff the Bus and Spring Spruce Up.
- Recruit and train community members as volunteers to participate in signature volunteer events.
- Ensure accurate volunteer and database records are kept for signature volunteer events and develop methods for continuous engagement.

Stuff the Bus – Annual project to put backpacks and school supplies into the hands of local homeless students

- Work with Community Engagement Manager to set goals, project plan, implementation calendar, and volunteers opportunities and tasks.
- Act as liasion with key partner Monterey County Office of Education to determine needed supplies, participating schools, reserve project space, determine distribution methods etc.
- Solicit bids from outside organizations to supply educational materials and manage ordering, shipping and delivery.
- Support the engagement of high level sponsors, community donors and in kind donations.

- Effective & Engaging Communicator Is an effective and passionate communicator, articulating the United Way message in a way that inspires other to act in service to the organization and the community.
- Detail Oriented Able to manage details of volunteer engagement opportunities including communications with project partners and volunteers, marketing materials and messages, and project planning and implementation.

 to achieve desired results. This includes the ability to gather, interpret and use relevant data
 to drive strategy development, make decisions and drive for results.
- Planning & Implementation Leads and takes initiative in planning and developing volunteer
 opportunities to support impact areas to achieve results that drive collective community
 outcomes.
- Embracing & Managing Change Adapts successfully to changing needs while maintaining positive relationships with all constituents, internal and external.
